

**SOME ANDERSON GRAVES IN FULTON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

The following list of Andersons buried in Fulton County, PA, was compiled by Glenn R. Cordell of the Fulton County Historical Society, McConnellsburg, PA, from that society's cemetery index file. It is believed to include all Fulton County cemeteries except Wells Valley Presbyterian. The notes that follow the list are by Charles E. Munat of 38 Preston Ave., Middletown, CT 06457.

### Notes

The number of each note corresponds to the grave number in the above list. So does each cross-reference in brackets.

1. This apparently is Andrew Hartman Anderson son of William S. Anderson [grave 34] and grandson of Samuel Anderson [grave 28] by his first wife Sarah (Shreeves) Anderson. This "A. H. Anderson" by 1859 [U.S. Census 1870, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 397, dwelling 97, family 123] married Susannah Ferree Trout [grave 31]. On 28 Sep 1866 at Six-Mile-Run, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, an Andrew H. Anderson became the 1st Secretary of Lodge No. 588 of the I.O.O.F. (Odd Fellows) which was organized on this date [History of Bedford... (1884), p. 340]. In 1867, an "Andrew Anderson" and a "Susan Anderson" were constituent members of the Church of God at Beavertown, Tod Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA [Africa (1883), p. 370]. In 1870, at age 35, with wife Susan (age 29), "A. H. Anderson" was a farmer owning real estate valued at \$2,500 and personal property valued at \$200, in Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA [U.S. Census 1870, p. 397, dwelling 97, family 123]. In about 1880 "A.H. Anderson" lived on Broad Top Mountain near an Indian burying ground "on the memorable Thousand Acre Tract" [D.F. Horton (1965), p. 7]. On 27 Mar 1893 "A.H. Anderson" appeared before the Fulton Co., PA, register of wills as administrator of his father's estate [Anderson, William S., his will...]. In April 1910, Andrew H. Anderson, a widower, aged 73, a miller who owns his own grist mill and his own mortgage-free farm, was living in Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA. Living with him was housekeeper Sarah Miller, widow, aged 64, mother of 7 children all living [U.S. Census 1910, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 54, dwelling 106, family 108]. On 13 Sep 1915 A. H. Anderson was still of Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, when he prepared his will [Anderson, Andrew H., his will...].

Andrew Hartman and Susan Ferree (Trout) Anderson were the parents of:

A. Sarah A[gnès] Anderson, born about 1859 [U.S. Census 1870, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 397, dwelling 97, family 123], married W.D. Corcoran and by 1915 resided in Pittsburgh, PA. [Anderson Andrew H., his will...; Smola].

B. Anna M. Anderson, born about 1862 [U.S. Census 1870, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 397, dwelling 97, family 123], married J.F. McEliver [Anderson, Andrew H., his will...; Smola].

C. William Rowland Anderson [grave 33].

D. Samuel Warren Anderson [grave 27].

2. This apparently is David R. Porter Anderson born 12 Jan 1839 (as interpreted from his gravestone), the son of Samuel [grave 28] and Maragaret (Porter) [grave 22] Anderson [Anderson, Margaret, her will...; U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 264, dwelling 49, family 49]. He married, by 1862, Elizabeth ( ? ) [grave 4] and they were the parents of at least four children [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 80, dwelling 54, family 51]:

A. Margaret Anderson, born about 1862.

B. David W. Anderson, born about 1864.

C. John Sherman Anderson [grave 11].

D. Emma M. Anderson, born about 1868.

4. This apparently is Elizabeth ( ? ), born 14 Feb 1836 (as interpreted from her gravestone), age 33 in Jun 1870 [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 80, dwelling 54, family 51], married David R. Porter Anderson [grave 2].

5. This apparently is Frances "Fanny" Grove, born 25 Aug 1804, daughter of Isaac and Ann (Long) Grove. [Grove, Isaac... Bible record...; History of Bedford... (1884), p. 336] Frances Grove married, as his second wife, James [grave 12] Anderson [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 126, family 126; U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 78, dwelling 35, family 32].

8. This apparently is Glenola [per grave] or "Ola" [Alloway (1929), p. 74] or "Leeda Mae" [White (1929), pp. 338] or "Leathia Mae Glenonia" [ibid., p. 363] Thomas, said to be of New Grenada, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, perhaps the daughter of Burling and Anna (Anderson) Thomas (but more likely a sister of Burling). Glenola married (Andrew) Hartman Anderson [grave 9].

9. This apparently is (Andrew) Hartman Anderson, born probably in Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA [U.S. Census 1910, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, dwelling 194, family 195], son of William Rowland [grave 33] and (Anna) Belle (Horton) Anderson, and grandson of Andrew Hartman [grave 1] and Susannah Ferree (Trout) [grave 31] Anderson. This (Andrew) Hartman Anderson, born presumably in Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, Nov 1896 [U.S. Census 1900, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 76, sheet 4, line 77 (Soundex)], married Glenola Thomas [grave 8], and they were the parents of [Alloway (1929), p. 74; White (1929), pp. 338, 363]:

- A. Robert Rowland Anderson.
- B. Mary Anderson [grave 23].
- C. Martha Anderson.
- D. Alice Louise Anderson.

10. This apparently is Henry Anderson, son of Edward and Susan (Horton) Anderson [Anderson, Edward, his will...], grandson of William and Elizabeth (Willett) Anderson, and nephew of both Samuel [grave 28] and James [grave 12] Anderson. Henry Anderson was born in PA about 1835 [age 75 in the Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, Enum. Dist. 52, dwelling 33, family 34] married about 1858 [married 52 years in the U.S. Census 1910, loc. cit.] Jane Sites [grave 13]. In 1910 Henry and Jane were living in Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, in their own unmortgaged home. Henry was working as a laborer doing odd jobs and had been unemployed 12 weeks of 1909. Apparently living in the same dwelling in 1910 were Vamurt? (age 36) and Susan (age 24) Divens, husband and wife married 10 years, and their four children Boyd and Loid, each age 9, Isabelle 2, and Katie 8 months. They had had one other child who was no longer living. Like Henry Anderson, Mr. Divens was an odd jobs laborer who had been unemployed 12 weeks in 1909. [U.S. Census 1910, loc. cit.]. Henry and Jane are said to be parents of:

A. Probably Malissa M. (for Mercene? called "Murceane" in the Census [U.S. Census 1880, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 210, sheet 24, line 32 (Soundex)]) Anderson, born 16 Sep 1857 (as interpreted from her gravestone), died 14 Apr 1893 at aged 35 years, 6 months, 28 days, buried in an "abandoned cemetery" at Knobsville, Fulton Co., PA. She married, by 1878, Sylvester W. Kelso [Rubincam (1951), p. 112; 1880 Soundex, loc. cit.]. They resided in Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, in 1880. Living with them was Ann Kelso, age 53, Sylvester's mother, Charlotte Wagner, age 65, Sylvester's aunt, and William Quarry, age 9, a bound child. Though the 1880 Census shows no children of "Murceane" and Sylvester (the Kelsos having lost an infant son Ira the year before [Rubincam, loc. cit.], Jane (Sites) Anderson's 1917 will says "I give and bequeath... unto my Daughter Mecene Kelso's heirs the Sum of one dollar" [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...]. Living with Mrs. Kelso's parents Henry and Jand (Sites) Anderson in 1910 were their grandchildren Nellie May Kelso, age 24 (occupation 'none'), and Lester S. Kelso, age 2 (sic, perhaps actually a great-grandchild?) [U.S. Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, Enum. Dist. 52, dwelling 33, family 34].

B. Savina Anderson [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...], born about 1859 [Quick], married Albert [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] Davis [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...; Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...; Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..] and in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...], 1920 [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...], and 1922 [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...] was living in Chambersburg, Greene Twp. Franklin Co., PA.

C. Clara Anderson, born about 1861 [Quick], married Daniel [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] Crouse [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary; Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...] and in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...], '20 [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...] and '22 [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary] was living in Waynesboro [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...; Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...], Washington Twp., Franklin Co., PA. "And further it is my desire... that my Dughter Clara Crouse have Set apart for her my Large Chest" [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...].

D. Walter B. Anderson [grave 35].

E. Mary M. (for Melinda? [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..]) Anderson, born in PA about 1870 [age 40 in the U.S. Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 52, dwelling 101, family 103], married about 1884 [26 years married in the 1910 Census, loc. cit.] Peter [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] Schiedleman [Anderson, Jane (Sites), Scheidleman U.S. Census 1910, loc. cit. her obituary...] or Schidleman [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..], born in Germany about 1858 [age 52 in the U.S. Census 1910, loc. cit.] and/or an Engel? Mary was of IL in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] '20 [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...], and '22 [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..].

F. William [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] H. [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..] (or W.?) Anderson, born about 1873 [Quick], was of Huntingdon Co., PA, in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...], of Trough Creek [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...], Tod Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, in 1920, and of Cassville, Cass Twp., Huutingdon Co., PA in 1922 [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...].

G. Charles [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...; Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...] E. Anderson, born about 1875 [Quick], was of MD in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] and of IL in 1922 [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...]. He is mentioned in his mother's 1917 will but not in her 1920 obituary.

H. Albert "Abert" "Bert" [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] T. Anderson [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...], born about 1878 [Quick], was of OH in 1914 [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...] and '20 [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...]. He is not mentioned in his sister Lillian's 1922 obituary and may have died by then [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary...]. "I give and bequeath... unto my Son abert Anderson or his heirs the Sum of one Dollar" [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...].

I. Katherine Anderson, born 1880 [Quick], probably died young.

J. Lillian Maude "Lillie" Anderson [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...; Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...] born in Burnt Cabins, Dublin Twp. Fulton Co., PA, 28 Feb 1880, died at age 42 on 7 Apr 1922, at her residence on "the Judge Hoop farm in Licking Creek Twp." She was survived by 11 children ranging in age from 3 weeks to 17 years. [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary] near Knobsville, Fulton Co., PA. She married 12 Oct 1904, in McConnellsburg, Fulton Co., PA, as his first wife, Charles Edward "Charley" [U.S. Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, dwelling 96, family 98] Tice [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will..], born 14 Jul 1879, in Knobsville, PA, died 16 Apr 1970, in Sandusky, Erie Co., OH, son of John Calvin and Catherine Elizabeth (Finiff) Tice [Quick]. Both Lillian and Charles are buried in Knobsville Cemetery, Fulton Co., PA [Quick; Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary]. In 1910 "Charley" Tice was employed as a laborer

doing odd jobs. He had been out of work only two weeks in 1909. The Tices lived in their own mortgaged home [U.S. Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, dwelling 96, family 98].

Lillian (Anderson) Tice was a "faithful member" of the Siloam Methodist Episcopal Church. She belonged to the Fraternal Home Insurance Society of Harrisonville, Fulton Co., PA, and to the Siloam Ladies' Aid Society. On 10 Apr 1922 her funeral was conducted by Rev. E. J. Croft, of Concord, Franklin Co., PA. He was assisted by Rev. H.L. Jarrett "conducting the religious services" [Tice, Lillian (Anderson), her obituary].

"It is my desire... that four brengths of Carpet in my room be Set apart to my Daughter Lillian Tice" [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...]. James Sites Anderson named Charles Tice her executor.

11. This apparently is John Sherman Anderson, born 3 Nov 1865 (as interpreted from his grave-stone), son of David R. Porter [grave 2] and Elizabeth ( ? ) [grave 4] Anderson. He was born in Dublin Mills, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, and died in Pittsburgh, PA, in a railroad accident. He was a laborer and was single. He was buried 26 Jan 1900 [Fulton County Deaths, vol. I... (in which he is mistakenly called "A. J. Anderson"?)].

12. This apparently is James Anderson, son of William Elizabeth (Willett) Anderson, and brother of Samuel Anderson [grave 28]. James Anderson was born in Hopewell Twp., Bedford County, PA, 17 Nov 1797 [Foster (1977)], died intestate about 12 o'clock midnight in his residence in Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA [Anderson, James, his... estate..., A]. He married first, by 1821, Mary Horton, daughter of Samuel and Martha (Evans) Horton [Anderson, Mrs. A.F. (1923), p. 75; Horton, D.F. (1965), p. 13; Horton, Samuel, his will...; Smola; Anderson, John... his obituary...; Anderson, John... his death certificate; Pleasantville Past... (1976), p. 121]. James and Mary were parents of:

A. Jane Anderson [Park, p. C49], born 16 Aug 1821--though the U.S. Census 1860 gives her age as 40 [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 122, family 122]--died 12 Nov 1898, married William Wible [Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E], born 3 Mar 1802 [Park, p. C65] or 17 Mar 1803 [McKenzie], died 12 Apr 1868, buried in Clear Ridge Cemetery, Fulton Co., PA. William is said to be son of Adam and ( ? ) (Gingrick) Wible [McKenzie]. In 1860 Jane and William lived on a farm with real estate valued at \$2,500 and personal property valued at \$120 [U.S. Census 1860, loc. cit.]. In 1870, newly widowed Jane (Anderson) Wible was "keeping house" near her father and brothers James and Levi, her real estate valued at \$1,000 and personal property at \$200. Enumerated with Jane then was a 7-year-old Mary Anderson [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 38, family 35].

B. Septamus Anderson [grave 30].

C. John Anderson, born 4 Feb 1825, in Bedford Co., PA [Anderson, Samuel Horton (1936), p. 92; Anderson, Samuel Horton (1938), p. 96]] died in Pleasantville, Marion Co., IA, 21 Aug 1914, buried Pleasantville, Cemetery. John Anderson married (1st), by 1843, Mary Figard [Anderson, John..., his Bible...], probably daughter of James [Figard, James, his will...; U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 263, dwelling 22, family 22] and Nancy (Sheckler) Figard [Biographical Review... (1899), pp. 26, 29, 163-64]; married (2nd), 28 Mar 1850, Jane Ramsey, born 1828 in PA, died 28 Apr 1873 in Pleasantville, IA, daughter of William and Sophia (Ramsey) Ramsey [Horton, Samuel Horton, (1938), p. 96]; (3rd) in Marion Co., IA, 30 Nov 1873, Jane (Lutz) Reins, born in Piqua Co., OH, 15 Apr 1923 (married 1st in IN, 1843, Ameted Reins), died in Pleasantville, IA, 13 Jan 1899; (4th) 13 Jul 1899, Useba "Ceby" (Addams) Thompson, born in IN in Dec 1835 (married 1st 25 Jun 1857 George W. Thompson), died in Pleasantville, IA, 21 Jan 1908.

John and Jane (Ramsey) Anderson removed, probably in 1852 [Anderson, Samuel Horton (1936), p. 92], from Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, "via the Ohio river boats" [Anderson, Samuel

Horton, his obituary...] Pilot Grove Twp., Hancock Co., IL; in Mar 1864 they removed to Pleasant Grove Township, Marion Co., IA. [Anderson, John... his Bible record; Anderson, John, his obituary; Anderson, John, his death certificate; Pleasantville Cemetery... (1976), p. 411; Marriage Records...Marion County... (1980), p. 3; U.S. Census 1900, Marion Co., IA, Enum. Dist. 52, Sheet 8, Line 411 (Soundex); Sands; Anderson, Jane (Lutz) Reins, her obituary; Anderson, Useba (Addams) Thompson, her obituary; U.S. Census 1850, Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, dwelling 92, family 92; U.S. Census 1860, Pilot Grove Twp., Hancock Co., IL, p. 435, dwelling 3104, family 3002; Pleasantville Past... (1976), p. 121; Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E; Park, p. C49]

D. Sarah "Sally" Anderson, born 28 Feb 1826 [Smola], died 20 Oct 1913, married George Figard, born about 1829 [U.S. Census 1860, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 100, dwelling 78, family 72], presumably the son of James and Nancy (Sheckler) Figard [Biographical Review... (1899), pp. 26, 29, 163-4]. George and Sally were proprietors of the hotel at Six-Mile-Run, PA [Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E; Foster (1977); Shaw; Park, pp. B14, C49].

E. David Anderson, born in PA about 1826, removed, probably by 1865, to "Cooperstownship," Brown Co., IL, where, in 1880, he resided with his (apparently 2nd) wife Isabella ( ? ) Anderson, born in KY, probably about 1828 [U.S. Census 1880, Cooperstownship, Brown Co., IL, p. 466, dwelling 52, family 52; Anderson, James his... estate..., D, E; Park, p. C49].

F. Mary Anderson, born about 1830 [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 126, family 126], married William McDonald. In 1880 Mary and William were residing in Springfield Twp., Fulton Co., PA. [U.S. Census 1880, Springfield Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 13, dwelling 75, family 75; Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E].

G. Samuel H. (for Horton?) Anderson, born 25 Feb 1831 [Smola], died 1 Jul 1901 [Smola] at Six-Mile-Run, Bedford Co., PA. He married (1st) (Sarah) Elizabeth Wible, born 30 Aug 1825, daughter of David and Jane (Marshall) Wible. Elizabeth (Wible) Anderson died 19 Aug 1880 in Maddensville, Huntingdon Co., PA. Samuel H. Anderson married (2nd) 26 Apr 1896 at Six-Mile-Run, PA, (Emma) Frances Salkeld, daughter of Mr. S.W. Salkeld and Mrs. M.R. Salkeld. Widow Frances (Salkeld) Anderson took ill of "Gaul Bladder Diabetes" on 10 Feb and died 21 Feb 1919 at "her father's house" and was buried in the Duvall Cemetery, Six-Mile-Run, Bedford Co., PA [Anderson, Samuel H., his pension record].

Samuel H. Anderson, a carpenter, served as a private and saddler in Co. I, 9th Regt., PA Cavalry, during the Civil War. He was 5' 10 1/2" tall and had fair skin, brown hair, and blue eyes. As of 3 Mar 1880 he was residing in Ogalla, Keith Co., NE [Anderson, Samuel H., his military record; Anderson, Samuel H., his pension record; Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E; Shaw].

H. Jonathan Anderson [grave 15].

I. Levi Anderson, born about 1837 [Smola], died 29 Nov 1910. He married and was the widower of Isabel Wible, born 16 Apr 1841, died 23 Sep 1905, daughter of David and Jane (Marshall) Wible [Park, p. C65]. Levi served in Co. C, 200th Regt., Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry [Park, p. B14]. In 1870, Levi and "Bell L." Anderson were living Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., PA, in the dwelling next to Levi's father. Levi was a farmer with real estate valued at \$1200 and personal property worth \$800 [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 78, dwelling 36, family 33]. In 1880, Levi and Isabel were living in Springfield Twp. Huntingdon Co. [U.S. Census 1880, Springfield Twp. Huntingdon Co., p. 14, dwelling 84, family 84]. Presumably this is the Levi Anderson who in 1881 opened a store "near the mills" in Meadow Gap, Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, and also owned a saw mill there [Africa (1883), p. 363]. This Levi Anderson became a minister of the Church of God at Three Springs, Clay Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA [Park, p. B14] and had a memorial chapel named after him at Brownsville or Selea (both in Springfield Twp.). The chapel was razed about 1927 [Park, pp. C50, 65, 71; Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E; Shaw]

J. Ephraim [Park, p. C49] F. (for Foster?) Anderson, born about 1839-40, died intestate, unmarried, and without issue, in Florida [Foster (1977)] in 1877, then a resident of Washington, D.C., but his estate was probated in Howard Co, MD [Anderson, Col. Ephraim F., his estate...]. His mother probably died at or shortly after his birth, and he was apparently sent to Howard Co., Maryland, perhaps to be raised by relatives there. [Anderson, Ephraim F., his military record; Anderson, Ephraim F., his pension record] A lawyer, on 25 Aug 1862, he became Captain commanding Company I, 7th Regt., Maryland Volunteer Infantry, and on 8 May 1864, in the first assault at Spotsylvania Court House, he assumed the lead, and within ten paces of the Confederate works, stopped three bullets, fell, and in the retreat that followed was left to be captured [Phelps (1898) pp. 248, 270-73]. He spent that summer a prisoner in the hospital of Libby Prison, Richmond, VA, until his parole on 1 Sep 64. On 13 Mar 1865 he was breveted Major for the gallantry he had demonstrated at the Battle of the Wilderness and on that same date was breveted Lt. Colonel for his conspicuous gallantry at the Battle of Spotsylvania Court House. [Anderson, Ephraim F., his military record] That same year he was appointed by President Andrew Johnson to be Appraiser of the Port of Baltimore [Marine Collection... Box 18, Folder 2]. On 30 May 1870 he delivered a memorial address at Antietam National Cemetery [Anderson, Ephraim F., "Memorial Address..."].

K. Mar[garet?] Anderson, born about 1840, living with James and Fanny (Grove) Anderson--presumably her father and step-mother--in Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, in 1860. [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 165, dwelling 126, family 126]. She is not mentioned as one of the nine children surviving her father in 1882 [Anderson, James, his... estate..., D, E], and may have been something other than a daughter, perhaps a niece, of James Anderson.

James Anderson married (2nd), about 1841-43, Frances "Fanny" Grove [grave 5]. James and Fanny's neighbors in Taylor Twp. at the time of the 1860 Census included James' son Jonathan (dwelling 123), Jonathan's father-in-law (dwelling 125), James' son Septamus (dwelling 124), and James' daughter Jane (Mrs. William) Wible (dwelling 122) [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., PA, p. 165]. In 1870, James and Fanny had no children left at home, but their household included Rebecca Myers, age 16 (called "Domsetic Ser."), Samuel Myers, age 14, and Florance Stephens, age 9. All three had attended school during the year [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 78, dwelling 35, family 32].

James and Fanny apparently were the parents of:

L. Martha Anderson, born 2 Feb 1844 [Smola], died in Three Springs, Clay Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, on Armistice Day, 11 Nov 1918. She married 1 Apr 1860--Martha, 16 years old and already married was enumerated in her parents' home in June 1860 [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 126, family 126]--in Clear Ridge, Dublin Twp., Fulton Co., PA, James M. Wible, born 9 Feb 1839 in Clear Ridge, PA, died 2 Jun 1899 in PA, son of David and Jane (Marshall) Wible. In 1870, Martha and James were living on a farm in Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, with real estate valued at \$2,000 and personal property valued at \$600 [U.S. Census 1870, Springfield Twp., Fulton Co., PA, page 792, dwelling 112, family 115]. Martha and James are buried in Clear Ridge Cemetery, Fulton Co., PA [McKenzie; Park, p. B14, C46-47, 53, 56-65, 65, 67, 69; Shaw].

13. This apparently is Jane Sites, born 3 Apr 1836 or '38, died at the home of her daughter Lillian Maude "Lillie" (Anderson) Tice near Harrisonville, Licking Creek Twp., Fulton Co., PA, 17 Apr 1920. Jane Sites was the daughter of Jacob and Christina (Glass) Sites. Jane Sites married, and was the widow of, Henry Anderson [grave 10]. She wrote her will 11 Dec 1917. [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...]. Jane (Sites) Anderson died "after an illness of several weeks from Grippe which developed into pneumonia." She was a member of the Church of God and a "highly respected lady." Her funeral services were held at 2:30 p.m., Tuesday, 20 Apr 1920, at the Methodist Episcopal Church that the cemetery adjoins [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her obituary...].

14. This apparently is John Allen Anderson, son of William Rowland [grave 33] and (Anna) Belle (Horton) Anderson [White (1929), p. 339]. John A. was not listed among their children in 1910 and so

apparently was born 1910 or later and died age 3 or younger [U.S. Census 1910, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, dwelling 194, family 195].

15. This apparently is Jonathan Anderson, born 3 Mar 1832, died 8 Nov [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...] or 15 Nov [Fulton County Deaths, vol. I...] 1900, of typhoid fever, at age 68. He was buried 17 Nov 1900 [loc. cit.]. Jonathan Anderson was the son of James [grave 12] and Mary (Horton) Anderson. Jonathan Anderson was married at Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, by the Rev. Simon Fleagle, on 5 Sep 1854 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], to Mary Jane Wible [grave 24]. Jonathan Anderson served from 7 Mar to 12 Nov 1865 in Co. H., 143rd Regt., PA Volunteers. At age 32, he was 5' 6 1/2" with light complexion, light hair, and blue eyes. [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...]. At age 38 he was a Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, farmer with land valued at \$1,000 and personal property worth \$600 [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36]. From 1881-83 Jonathan Anderson was administrator of his father's estate [Anderson, James, his... estate..., A-M].

Jonathan and Mary Jane (Wible) Anderson were parents of [Park, pp. C48, 54]:

A. Elihu Anderson, born in PA 25 Apr 1857 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], died 21 Jul 1908, married Louisa [Park, p. C48] or Junie [U.S. Census 1900, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, enum. dist. 73, sheet 7, line 78 (Soundex)] Kerlin, born in PA Aug 1864. In 1900 Elihu and Junie were residing in Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA. [Cf. U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 123, family 123; U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36; Park, p. 54.]

B. Ephraim J. Anderson, born 17 Nov 1859. He married Celia ( ? ), born in PA in Feb 1863, and in 1900 they were living in Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, but in his will dated 13 Sep 1915, he describes himself as of Wells Twp. [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp. Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 123, family 123; Anderson Ephraim J., his will...; Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...; U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36; U.S. Census 1900, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, enum. dist. 73, sheet 7, line 75 (Soundex); Park, p. C48].

C. Charilla? [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36] (pension record looks like "Teriller") Anderson, born 18 Mar 1861 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...].

D. Samantha Anderson, born 1 Nov 1863 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], married Harris Wagner [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36; Park, p. C48].

E. Alferetta Anderson, born in PA 31 Aug 1866 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], died 17 May 1952. She married, by 1891, George Swartz, born in PA Dec 1866--possibly the son of Daniel and Charlotte (Madden) Swartz. In 1900 they were residing in Carbon Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA [Park, pp. C48, 54; U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36; U.S. Census 1900, Carbon Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, enum. dist. 81, sheet 13, line 67 (Soundex); and cf. Commemorative... Juniata... (1897), p. 403].

F. Louisa Anderson, born in PA 29 Jan 1868 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], married by 1893 James L. Kerlin, born in PA Jul 1861. In 1900 they were residing in Dublin Twp., Fulton Co., PA [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36; U.S. Census 1900, Dublin Twp., Fulton Co., PA, enum. dist. 70, sheet 2, line 93 (Soundex); Park, p. C48].

G. Jennie Anderson, born 25 Jan 1870 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], married James McElheny [Park, p. C49; U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 79, dwelling 39, family 36].



H. Grant Anderson, born 18 Mar 1872 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...], married Gertrude (Madden?) [Park, p. C48].

I. Myrtle "Myrtie" Anderson [Park, p. C49], born 25 Feb 1874 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...]. This must be the "Myrtle Anderson" who, apparently still unmarried, on 29 May 1908, at Vail, Blair Co., PA, witnessed her mother's mark on an application for a new pension certificate. [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...].

J. Nerissa Anderson, born 6 Feb 1876 [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...] married (1st) George Price [Park, p. C48].

20. This apparently is Margaret Leslie ( ? ), born 1879 in PA of a VA-born father and PA-born mother [U.S. Census 1910, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 54, dwelling 59, family 60], wife and widow of Samuel Warren Anderson [grave 27].

21. This apparently is Mabel Rae Laidig, born in Laidig, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA. [Alloway (1929), p. 74]. She married William Pasco Anderson [grave 36].

22. This apparently is Margaret Porter, born 26 Dec 1797 (as interpreted from her gravestone), second wife and widow of Samuel Anderson [grave 28]. In 1870 she was living with her son "Porter" and family in Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA [U.S. Census 1870, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 80, dwelling 54, family 51]. She wrote her will 19 May 1860 saying that "my Express will and mering is that no other heir of mine to get any of my Property or Estat but my beloved Sone [grave 2] David R P Anderson" [Anderson, Margaret (Porter), her will...].

23. This apparently Mary Anderson, daughter of (Andrew) Hartman [grave 9] and Glenola (Thomas) [grave 8] Anderson. Mary lived about 2 years.

24. This apparently is Mary Jane (called "Lessie"? [Park, C48, 54]) Wible, born 4 Sep 1834, parents unknown. She married and was the widow of Jonathan Anderson [grave 15]. At the time of her death, she was said to be of Hustontown (Dublin Twp. Fulton Co.), PA [Anderson, Jonathan, his pension...; U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., p. 165, dwelling 123, family 123].

27. This apparently is Samuel Warren Anderson--son of Andrew Hartman [grave 1] and Susannah Ferree (Trout) [grave 31] Anderson--born Jun 1879. About 1901 Samuel married Margaret Leslie ( ? ) [grave 20]. In 1910 Samuel Anderson was a farmer, and he and his family were living on a rented farm in Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA. (Living with the Andersons in 1910 was 14-year-old choreboy Harry L. A[wk?]erman.) Samuel and Margaret's first three children, all born in PA [U.S. Census 1910, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 54, dwelling 59, family 60], probably in Wells Twp., were:

A. Margaret E. Anderson, born about 1902.

B. William Lee Anderson [grave 32].

C. Eveline M. Anderson, born about Dec 1909.

28. This apparently is Samuel Anderson, born in Maryland 6 Oct 1785 [Foster (1977)], son of Broad Top pioneers William and Elizabeth (Willett) Anderson. He wrote his will 27 Oct 1855 and it was proven 19 Nov of that year [Anderson, Samuel, his will...]. Samuel married first Sarah, said to be Sarah Shreves [Smola; Foster (1977)], daughter of Broad Top pioneer Jeremiah Shreves and his wife Sarah. [See History of Bedford... (1884), p. 336; Horton, D.F. (1965), p. 14.] Samuel and Sarah's children were:

A. William S. ) Anderson [grave 34].

B. James Anderson, born about 1813 [Smola], called "my son James Anderson Decd." in his father's will. [Anderson, Samuel, his will...]

C. Levi Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born Sep 1815 [Smola] in Huntingdon Co, PA, died 13 Aug 1881 in Johnson Co., IA, married 2 Mar 1840 in Bedford Co., PA, Permelia Clapper, born 10 May 1819 in Bedford Co., PA, died 17 Jan 1885 in Johnson Co., IA, daughter of Jacob and Mary ( ? ) Clapper. Levi and Permelia removed to IA in 1853. Both are buried in Ridgewood Cemetery, North Liberty, Penn Twp., Johnson Co., IA. [History of Johnson... (1883), p. 79; Engel (1980), pp. 127-28; Ridgewood Cemetery, p. 22; U.S. Census 1850, Cass Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, p. 213, dwelling 130, family 130]

D. Thomas Anderson, [Anderson, Samuel, his will...] born about 1811, probably the Thomas Anderson, farmer, age 50, who was of Tod Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, in 1860, with wife Anna, also age 50, and with land valued at \$7,000, and personal property valued at \$2,120 [U.S. Census 1860, Tod Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, p. 605, dwelling 36, family 37].

E. John A. Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born 16 Dec 1823 in Bedford Co, PA, died 3 May 1879 in Johnson Co., IA [Smola], and was buried in Ridgewood Cemetery, North Liberty, Penn Twp., Johnson Co., IA. He married 22 Jun 1845, in PA, Catherine Hoover, born 2 Aug 1818, died 4 Sep 1891, daughter of John and Anna ( ? ) Hoover. John A. Anderson was a carpenter, cabinet maker, and farmer. At least three Bedford Co., PA, land warrantees were issued in the name of John A. Anderson in 1852-53: the first, to "John A. Anderson," was for 71 acres and issued 6 Sep 1852; the second, to "John A. Anderson, Ex.," was for 35 acres, on the same date; the third, to "John A. Anderson," was for 7 1/2 acres, issued 3 Mar 1853 [Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd series, vol. 25 (1898), p. 455]. John A. Anderson is said to have removed to Johnson Co., IA, in 1853 and there served as a county supervisor and township trustee and a deacon of the Church of God. [History of Johnson... (1883), p. 79; Ridgewood Cemetery, p. 24]

F. Samuel S. Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born 15 Sep 1826 in PA, died 18 Mar 1863 in Johnson Co., IA, married Elizabeth ( ? ), born 15 Aug 1826, died 17 Apr 1902. This Elizabeth ( ? ) Anderson was living in Jefferson Twp., Johnson Co., IA, in 1900 with her son Elliott, age 48. Both Samuel S. Anderson and Elizabeth are buried in Ridgewood Cemetery [Smola; Ridgewood Cemetery, p. 22], North Liberty, Penn Twp., Johnson Co., IA.

G. Mary Anderson, born about 1830 [Smola] in PA, married, 1850 or later [U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 264, dwelling 49, family 49] Jacob Wible [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born 8 Jul 1825? [McKenzie], perhaps the son of Adam and Jane (Long) Wible [Park, p. C66]. Mary, age 39, and Jacob, age "37", were living in Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., PA, in 1870, with no children [U.S. Census 1870, Springfield Twp., Huntingdon Co., p. 787, dwelling 49, family 50].

H. Mark D. Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born about 1832 [U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 264, dwelling 49, family 49].

I. Susan Jane Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...], born about 1834 [Smola] in PA, may have married Samuel Wible [U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 264, dwelling 49, family 49].

J. Elizabeth Anderson [Smola], by 1855 the wife of Jonathan Alloways [Anderson, Samuel, his will...]. A Jonathan Alloway received two warrantees for Huntingdon Co., PA, land. The first, on 19 Mar 1853, was for 30 acres; the second, on 6 Jan 1855, was for 20 acres [Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd series, vol. 25 (1898), p. 679].

Samuel Anderson married (2nd), by 1838?, Margaret Porter [grave 22], and, though he was 63 and she 42, in 1839 they seem to have had a child (though perhaps he was adopted or was Margaret's child by a

K. David R. Porter Anderson [grave 2]

Pennsylvania land warrantees issued in the name of Samuel Anderson include: in Bedford Co., 175 acres issued 7 Feb 1814, and, in Huntingdon Co., 5 acres (to Samuel Anderson and "others in trust") issued 20 Jan 1831, 140 acres issued 16 Jan 1837, and 3 acres (to "Samuel Anderson, Ex.") issued 19 Jun 1844 [Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd series, vol. 25 (1898), pp. 454, 679].

This may be the Samuel Anderson who "built a mill on Six Mile run about the year 1827 or 1830, which did us a good job" [History of Bedford... (1906), vol. I, p. 401]. This is the Samuel Anderson who is said to have bought the "mountain house property," Bedford County, from his uncle Samuel Willett [D.F. Horton (1965), p. 16]. Perhaps this is the Broad Top Twp. farm, with real estate valued at \$3,000, that Sam and Margaret were living on at the time of the U.S. Census 1850 [U.S. Census 1850, Broad Top Twp. Bedford Co., PA, p. 264, dwelling 49, family 49]. Anderson "made improvement and sold out [in] 1855 and removed to Taylor Twp. in Fulton Co. [PA], where he bought a fine farm and there lived a few years and he and his good lady died" [D.F. Horton, loc. cit.].

29. This apparently is Savina Griffith who married and was the widow of Walter B. [grave 35] Anderson [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...; Quick].

30. This apparently is Septamus Anderson, born 22 Nov 1823 [as interpreted from his gravestone; Smola, & Park, p. B11, 13, says 29 Oct 1822] in Hustontown, now Dublin Twp., Fulton Co., PA., died of tuberculosis 27 Apr 1866 [says gravestone; Park, p. B11, says 4 Apr 1866], son of James [grave 12] and Mary (Horton) Anderson. [Park, p. B11, says Septamus is son of Fanny (Grove) Anderson, but this is surely an error, as Mary (Horton) Anderson was alive to receive a payment from her father's estate as late as 1839; see Horton, Samuel, his estate....]

Land warrantees for 40 acres in Bedford Co., PA, and for 40 acres in Huntingdon Co., PA, were simultaneously issued to a Septamus Anderson on 3 Mar 1848. On 30 Aug 1852 he received a another warrantee for 40 more Huntingdon Co. acres [Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd series, vol. 25 (1898), pp. 455, 679]. Septamus Anderson married, by 1859, (La Vina) Jane Mort, born 11 Nov 1842, daughter of Abram and Rebecca (Woods) Mort. [Cf. U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 165, dwelling 125, family 125.] Septamus and Jane were the parents of:

A. Frances R. Anderson, born 27 Feb 1860, died 5 Nov 1939, married (Winfield) Scott Gutshall [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 165, dwelling 124, family 124; Anderson, James...his estate..., D, E; Park pp. B11, C47].

B. Mary Anderson, born 17 Sep 1861, died 11 Aug 1950, married by 1881 Daniel (not Alexander?) Everhart, born Apr 1857. In 1900 they were living in Croyle Twp., Cambria Co., PA [Park, pp. B12-13, C47; U.S. Census 1900, Croyle Twp., Cambria Co., E.D. 113, sheet 2, line 52 (Soundex); Anderson, James...his estate..., D, E].

C. James C. Anderson, born 17 Oct 1863, died 18 Sep 1940, married (1st) Mary Jane "Jennie" Wagner--born 6 Aug 1867, died 4 Jan 1907--and (2nd), as her 2nd husband, Gladys ( ? ) Snyder, born 18 Aug 1896, died 20 Aug 1966 [Park, pp. B12-13, C47]. Wolf

D. Samuel Anderson, born 9 Sep 1865, died 19 Jul 1951, married, by 1885, Jennie Roher [Park, pp. A38, B13, C47], born 7 Mar 1869, died 6 Jul 1916, daughter of Simeon and Eliza (Gutshall) Roher Roher. (Jennie's mother had married first Sampson Roher who was killed in the Civil War. She then married Sampson's brother Simeon.) Jennie (Roher) Anderson was an accomplished seamstress. Samuel Anderson worked many years for Rockhill Coal & Iron Co. and later was chief custodian for Robertsdale Elementary and High School in Huntingdon Co., PA. "The school children loved his quiet, genteel, considerate man [Park, p. B13]."

(La Vina) Jane (Mort) Anderson married (2nd) Benjamin Marshbarger, presumably the same Benjamin Marshbarger who was a 16-year-old farmhand living in the Anderson home in 1860 [U.S. Census 1860, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA, p. 165, dwelling 124, family 124].

31. This apparently is Susan Ferree Trout, born in Wells Valley, Fulton Co., PA, daughter of Isaac and Sarah ( ? ) Trout. She married Andrew Hartman Anderson [grave 1] and died 5 Feb 1901, age 65, "cause unk." She was buried on 8 Feb 1901 [Fulton County Deaths, vol. I...].

32. This apparently is William Lee Anderson, age 6 in 1910 [U.S. Census 1910, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, dwelling 59, family 60], son of Samuel Warren Anderson [grave 27] and of Margaret Leslie ( ? ) Anderson [grave 20], married Lottie ( ? ) who apparently survived him.

33. This apparently is William Rowland Anderson [Anderson, Andrew H., his will...], born 29 Nov 1865 (interpreting his grave record), son of Andrew Hartman Anderson [grave 1] and of Susan Ferree (Trout) Anderson [grave 31]. William R. Anderson, of Enid, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, on 22 Apr 1895, married, as her first husband, (Anna) Belle Horton, born 2 Oct 1876 in New Grenada, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, daughter of Zophar Pasco and Matilda (Sharrar) Horton. In 1900 "William R." and "Anna B" Anderson resided in Wells, Twp., Fulton Co., PA, with their children "Andrew H.," age 3, "Wilber P.," age 2, and "infant," age "0/12" [1900 U.S. Census, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 76, sheet 4, line 77 (Soundex)]. In 1910 William Anderson, age 43, a farmer, working on his rented "home farm," and Belle Anderson, age 32, his wife, mother of six children all then living, were residing in Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA [U.S. Census 1910, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, dwelling 194, family 195]. William Rowland Anderson and (Anna) Belle (Horton) Anderson were the parents of [Alloway (1929), p. 74; White (1929), pp. 338-9]:

A. Andrew Hartman Anderson [grave 9] married Glenola "Ola" Thomas [grave 8].

B. Anna May Anderson, age 9 in 1910, may have married Burling Thomas.

C. Alice Susan Anderson, age 7 in 1910.

D. Alloway Anderson, not listed in 1910 Census, perhaps died young.

E. Mary Agnes Anderson, age 3 in 1910.

F. William Pasco Anderson [grave 36].

G. (Franklin) Rowland Anderson, age 6/12 in 1910 Census.

H. John Allen Anderson [grave 14].

(Anna) Belle (Horton) Anderson married second, on 22 Sep 1917, Harlan Wishart, a farmer, of Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA [Alloway (1929), p. 74; White (1929), pp. 338-9].

34. This apparently is William S. Anderson [Anderson, Samuel, his will...] son of Samuel [grave 28] and Sarah (Shreves) Anderson. William S. (for Samuel or Shreves?) Anderson, wrote his will 1 Jan 1880, died 12 Mar 1893 in Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, and his will was proved 27 Mar 1893. [Anderson, William S., his will...]. Wife Eliza Jane is named in his will, but an earlier wife, probably the mother of his children, was named Sarah Agnes (perhaps Dunlap, for 90-year-old James Dunlap was living with William and Sarah in 1860) Anderson, born about 1813. On 10 May 1847 a "Wm. S. Anderson" obtained a warrant for 300 acres of land in Bedford Co., PA [Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd series, vol. 25 (1898), p. 454]. In 1860 William S. and Sarah Agnes Anderson were living in Broad Top Twp., Fulton Co., PA. Their land, if they owned any, was not valued in the U.S. Census 1860, but the value of their personal property was put at \$300. William S. Anderson's occupation was farmer [Anderson, William S., his will...; U.S.

A. Clara Ann Anderson, born about 1836, married ( ? ) Miller [Smola; Anderson, William S., his will...; U.S. Census 1860, Broad Top Twp., Bedford Co., PA, p. 100, dwelling 80, family 73].

B. Andrew Hartman Anderson [grave 1].

35. This apparently is Walter B. Anderson, born 23 Mar 1863 (age 50 years, 11 months, 26 days at death), died at his home near Knobsville, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, 18 Mar 1914, after 9 days' illness with erysipelas--"an acute febrile disease associated with intense edematous local inflammation of the skin and subcutaneous tissues caused by a hemolytic streptococcus." Walter B. was the son of Henry [grave 10] and Jane (Sites) [grave 13] Anderson [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...; Quick].

Walter B. Anderson was a "consistent member" of the Methodist Episcopal church and "always active in its service." He belonged to the Junior Order United American Mechanics at Waynesboro, PA, and to the Sons of Veterans at McConnellsburg, PA. On Saturday, 21 Mar 1914, his funeral was conducted by Rev. J.L. Yearick of the Reformed church [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...].

Walter B. Anderson married Savina Griffith [grave 29]. In 1910 Walter B. Anderson, farmer, age 47, and his wife Savina Anderson, age 48, were living on their own mortgage-free farm in Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA. Residing with them was a 7-year-old niece Blanche V. Anderson [U.S. Census 1910, Todd Twp., Fulton Co., PA, dwelling 15, family 15]. Walter B. and Savina were the parents of at least one child:

A. Blanche Anderson married Edward Rotz and in 1914 resided in Attenwald, Franklin Co., PA [Anderson, Walter B., his obituary...; Quick]. In her will, Jane (Sites) Anderson leaves to "my Grand daughter Blanch Rotz my Son Walter andersons Large Picture" [Anderson, Jane (Sites), her will...].

36. This apparently is William (called Wilber, Wilbur, and Wilbert) Pasco Anderson, born presumably in Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, Jan 1898 [1900 U.S. Census, Wells Twp., Fulton Co., PA, E.D. 76, sheet 4, line 77 (Soundex)], "an enlisted soldier in the World War," son of William Rowland [grave 33] and (Anna) Belle (Horton) Anderson Wishart. This apparently is the Wilbur Anderson, grandson of Andrew Hartman Anderson [grave 1] in Andrew's 1915 will [Anderson, Andrew H., his will...]. William Pasco Anderson married Mabel Rae Laidig [grave 21] of Laidig, Taylor Twp., Fulton Co., PA. As of 1929, they are said to have been childless [Alloway (1929), p. 74; White (1929), pp. 338-9].

Summary

The above-annotated graves are all graves of descendants of, or of spouses of descendants, of Broad Top Pioneers William and Elizabeth (Willett) Anderson. This can be outlined as follows:

Son JAMES ANDERSON [grave 12] married (1st) Mary Horton & (2nd) FANNY GROVE [grave 5].

Grandson DAVID R. PORTER ANDERSON [grave 2] married ELIZABETH ( ? ) [grave 4].

Great-grandson JOHN SHERMAN ANDERSON [grave 11] died unmarried.

Grandson WILLIAM S. ANDERSON [grave 34] married Sarah Agnes ( ? ) & Eliza Jane ( ? ).

Great-grandson ANDREW HARTMAN ANDERSON [grave 1] married SUSANNAH FERREE TROUT [grave 31]

Great-great-grandson SAMUEL WARREN ANDERSON [grave 27] married MARGARET LESLIE ( ? ) [grave 20].

Great-great-great-grandson WILLIAM LEE ANDERSON [grave 32] married Lottie ( ? )

Great-great-grandson WILLIAM ROWLAND ANDERSON [grave 33] married (Anna) Belle Horton.

Great-great-great-grandson (ANDREW) HARTMAN ANDERSON [grave 9] married GLENOLA THOMAS [grave 8].

Great-great-great-great-granddaughter MARY ANDERSON [grave 23] died young.

Great-great-great-grandson WILLIAM PASCO ANDERSON [grave 36] married MABEL RAE LAIDIG [grave 21].

Great-great-great-grandson JOHN ALLEN ANDERSON [grave 14] died young.

Son Edward Anderson married Susan Horton.

Grandson HENRY ANDERSON [grave 10] married JANE SITES [grave 13].

Great-grandson WALTER B. ANDERSON [grave 35] married SAVINA GRIFFITH [grave 29].
