

The Linthicums of Linthicum Walks Our ANDERSONS

From Handwritten Notes (about the Linthicums) found among the papers of the late Mrs. Cora Woodward (Anderson) Dulaney:

"This" [referring to the old published genealogy of the Linthicums] "has a lot of local people."

"Hezekiah Linthicum owned all of the Fork" [referring to the "Great Fork of the Patuxent River, near Woodwardville"] "from the Ford up to and above where Shubert Meyer lives" [referring to the present day Meyer Station tract located in the "lower portion" of the "Great Fork"].

"Most of these people now live up around Linthicum Heights" [referring, of course, to the upper (Northern) Anne Arundel County community today called "Linthicum", near BWI Airport, to which many of the Linthicum descendants initially moved when they departed the "Great Fork"].

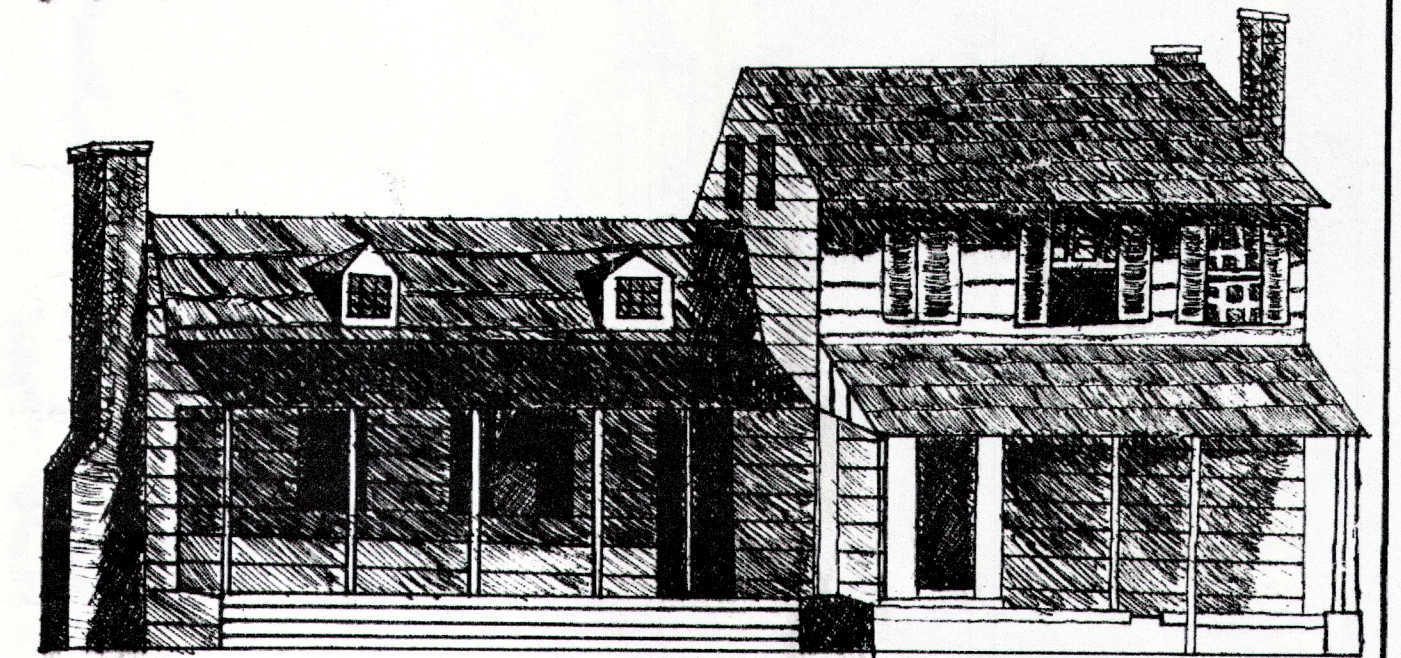
"Leonard Wayman lived where Mr. Fritz Sander" [formerly lived], at the intersection of today's Conoways Road and Patuxent Road, slightly West of the Crain Highway (Md. Route No. 3).

"Thomas Linthicum lived where Mr. Zalder" [formerly lived, literally "next door" to where Leonard Wayman, Thomas Linthicum's father-in-law, lived, as described above].

WILLIAM ANDERSON, JR., and his wife,
Elizabeth (LINTHICUM) ANDERSON,
had at least one son:
LEONARD ANDERSON
(so named after his maternal grandfather,
LEONARD WAYMAN, SR.);

Leonard Anderson inherited (*circa* 1735), under the law of primogeniture (as the eldest son) then in effect, from his intestate then deceased father, William Anderson, Jr., in Baltimore County, two pieces of (speculative) real estate (which William Anderson, Jr., earlier had obtained by two separate land patents) where they never apparently resided, (1) *Andersons Barins* (100 acres near the Gunpowder Falls) which Leonard Anderson sold and conveyed (apparently while he was unmarried, and possibly while he was still a minor) on Sept. 15, 1735, to Oliver Matthews (Balto. County Liber B.B. #1, folios 460 and 586; and (2) *Buffaloe* (49 acres near Piney Run) which Leonard Anderson (styled "carpenter") sold and conveyed on Sept. 1, 1756, to Thomas Browd (Balto. County Liber B.B. #1, folio 585. *Query*: Did William Anderson, Jr., and Elizabeth (Linthicum) Anderson also have at least one daughter who married a Benjamin Salman/Sellman? Were there other children?

* (One of their (half?) brother(s) was Ensign Edward Edwards (III), of the 4th Md. Reg., Continental Army, Am. Rev., who died unmarried and intestate. See Anne Arundel County Adm. Accts. Lib. J.G. No. 1, fo. 69, dtd. Sept. 23, 1793. On Feb. 20, 1916, at the Anderson House near duPont Circle in Washington, D.C., a direct lineal descendant of "our" Edward Edwards Anderson, William Warner Anderson, Jr., was initiated into the Maryland Society of the Cincinnati by virtue of his collateral descent from Ensign Edward Edwards, III.)

Conclusion: Thus, the impression is left that the Linthicums and early Andersons (after the latter had departed the West River/Herring Creek area in extreme Southern Anne Arundel County) were living and farming at various places and locations along today's Davidsonville Road, extending from the general area of *Linthicum Walks* (opposite today's "Crofton"), at the Southern "end", in a Northerly and Westerly direction along that same Road across Maryland Route No. 3 "up" into and including the areas of the intersection of the Conoways Road and Patuxent Road before William (II) Anderson married his wife, Susannah (Meek) Phelps, the widow who had inherited what became *Providence Plantation* located just "down the road" a little further at Woodwardville itself.

Furthermore, the presence of the same rather unusual first name, Leonard, three times in different early generations of Andersons (in both the Anne Arundel as well as the Baltimore County lines) is offered as the "primary" and "best" circumstantial evidence that (a) there was a William Anderson, Jr. (who was a brother of "our" John Anderson, of West River); and (2) that "our" William (II) Anderson (who married the Phelps widow and lived after such marriage at *Providence Plantation*) really was the son of the above John Anderson - if ever, in recent years, there was any doubt.
